

Antigoni Sarantaki

Dr Antigoni Sarantaki, currently holds the position of an Assistant Professor in Midwifery Department, Faculty of Health & Caring Sciences at the University of West Attica in Athens. She received her Master of Science from University of Surrey, School of Health Sciences, at Guildford, United Kingdom. She achieved her Ph.D. from Dept. of Medicine (Sector of Social Medicine-Psychiatry and Neurology), School of Health Sciences, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, Greece. The focus of her doctoral research was family relationships and psycho-emotional development of children born after assisted reproduction. Her research and teaching include women's mental health, peripartum midwifery care, infertility, assisted reproduction, family dynamics and semiology. Her previous research included funded projects that investigated infertility, perinatal health of refugee and asylum-seeking women in Greece and digital resource to enhance parental health literacy. Dr Sarantaki has authored several papers and chapters in peer reviewed journals on topics including women's health issues, infertility related stress, parental attachment, perinatal care for women with disabilities etc. She also teaches in several MSc programs. She has been engaged in research funded by EU. She has centered her research now, in examining factors promoting maternal-fetal health.
